**Application, recommendations, and transcript must be received by February 1 to take the February 2 assessment.*

We give our own Admission Assessment on Saturday mornings so we can offer flexible and cost-free testing to students, get a chance to meet and interact with prospective students and answer their questions, score the assessments in-house to better understand each student's thought process, and provide parents an opportunity to ask questions of the Head of School.

Assessments begin promptly at 9:30 a.m.; plan to arrive by 9:20 a.m. in Room 20 of the Science Building and finish at 11:30 a.m. Seating is limited; call or email to reserve a seat.

The Admission Assessment consists of two sections:

1. Mathematics (30 minutes)

- mathematical relationships
- mathematical concepts—fractions, lowest common denominators, ratios, word problems, simple geometry, and data analysis

2. English (60 minutes)

- sentence mechanics
- reading comprehension
- writing sample

○ APPLICATION

February 1, 2019

Online application with \$80 fee (\$150 for international applicants) should be submitted online by February 1. Contact the Admission Office if you'd prefer a paper application. Remember, the application is only one part of the admission process and is used to get to know the student before the interview.

TIP: Apply online at york.org/online-application.

Submit your application as early as possible in order to receive priority interview scheduling.

Interviews do not take place until the application, recommendations, and transcript are received.

○ RECOMMENDATIONS

February 1, 2019

The Admission Office must receive all three recommendations (Math, English, Principal or Counselor) no later than February 1. Be sure to give the teachers stamped envelopes addressed to York. Online recommendation request forms are also available at york.org/application-process which may be submitted from a teacher's valid school email address.

TIP: It is best to do this before the winter holiday as

it gives teachers ample time and increases the likelihood that all forms are received by the deadline.

○ TRANSCRIPT

February 1, 2019

The Admission Office must receive an official transcript no later than February 1, including first semester or trimester marks for the current year. Remember to give the signed transcript release form along with a stamped envelope to the student's current school Registrar.

○ INTERVIEW

January 15 - February 28, 2019

It is important that we get to know prospective students and give them the opportunity to ask questions about York. Once an applicant's file is complete (visit, admission assessment results, application, recommendations, and transcript), we will call to set up a 15 minute conversation on campus for the applicant and two members of the Faculty Admission Committee.

TIP: Our Admission Committee wants to hear what you'd like to know about York. Bring a question or two of your own to the interview.


